Minimum Qualifications:

- Master's Degree in one of the Behavioral Sciences, Medicaid Eligibility
- Valid Alabama driver's license, maintenance of a good driving record, personal automobile liability coverage (\$20,000-\$40,000)
- Successful completion of the Department of Mental Health approved in-home therapy and case management training programs
- At least one year of experience in child and adolescent or family therapy.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

1. Provides direct in-home therapy services as part of a multidisciplinary treatment team.
 - Collects and verifies all required information during intake and initial in-home contacts
 - Delivers individualized therapeutic services in accordance with accepted professional standards, agency policies, and each consumer's plan of care
 - Actively follows up with consumers regarding missed or canceled appointments
 - Exercises sound clinical judgment regarding referrals and coordination of services
 - Completes concise, accurate clinical documentation within one full working day of all services provided
 - Meets assigned quarterly averages for billable direct services
 - Maintains effective consultation and collaboration with community agencies

2. Serves as a liaison and provides education for the Center, community partners, and the general public.

- Delivers consultation and educational presentations in a professional and effective manner
- Tailors presentations appropriately to the intended audience
- Acts as a positive advocate for mental health services within the community

3. Maintains and enhances professional skills and competencies.

- Attends and actively participates in professional workshops, in-service trainings, and Quality Assurance reviews
- Remains current on professional literature related to therapeutic interventions for children/adolescents with Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED), as well as family, couples, and group therapy, and integrates evidence-based practices into service delivery
- Participates in scheduled staff meetings and clinical supervision
- Effectively utilizes agency staff for consultation and clinical support

4. Provides 24-hour crisis intervention services as required.

- Responds to emergencies as needed, ensuring client safety and welfare in accordance with emergency and safety policies
- Safely transports clients to and from appointments, activities, and other scheduled services when required
